The Power of Presence

The other day I sat with a friend who was hurting. My friend had experienced great hurt and great loss and she feared that she may be hurt again. Some would say that her fears were irrational. After all, the hurt she experienced at the hands of another had been acknowledged and seemingly dealt with. However, my friend felt that more effort and energy had been poured into rehabilitating (and to some degree protecting) the perpetrator than had been expended making sure that she and the other victims were okay.

She was weary and buckling under the weight of caring for others, putting on a brave face, and trying to take the advice of others and move past it all. I listened as she spoke of her hurt. I listened as her hurt gave way to anger and rage. I had few words of advice or comfort. In fact, the more I listened, the more I began to identify with how she was feeling.

The meal we shared served to ease some of tension and remind us of at least one of life's joys. Naturally I insisted that we order dessert, and it was one more reason to smile in the midst of everything we were confronting. Soon we found ourselves laughing at how quickly the cheesecake had disappeared, and lost for a moment was the memory of the tears that had so recently been shed.

As we drove back my thoughts turned toward my own shortcomings. I quietly wondered if our time together had done any good. We hadn't solved anything and again, I had no sagely advice to give. I wasn't a counselor or a therapist. I had no magic wand to wave away the troubles with. I'd only had time, food, and a listening ear to offer. Was that anything let alone enough? That's when I was reminded of a most important truth. I am the church, and the power of presence is never to be underestimated. We are the church, and while we cannot always calm the storms of life, we can certainly be present with those who are trying to navigate them. We are the church, and where we are there comfort, consolation, and love should be also. If we specialize in anything it should be in presence, in showing up, in coming alongside, and in leaving behind an awareness of being deeply loved.

This we can do today wherever we are and with whatever we have at our disposal. My prayer is simple. May God show us the places where our presence can facilitate his healing and his love. May we enter those places with joy and without fear. Emmanuel. Amen.


