As we enter the last month of the year, the Backpack Mission is our focus. We received this letter from Southwest Middle School that expresses the need and gratitude for this program:

Dear First Baptist Church Family,

On behalf of the Southwest Middle School faculty and staff, I would like to extend our sincerest gratitude to your church family for your weekly sponsorship of food for our most vulnerable students and families.

Students selected to participate in the food assistance program are referred by their school counselor, social worker, and/or teacher. There are a number of reasons why a student's family may be referred to the program, such as --homelessness, through observation of a student exhibiting consistent hunger, and through disclosure of food scarcity at home.

Collectively, the food assistance is positively impacting our families. The recipients of the food assistance express their appreciation at each weekly pickup. One family stated, "The weekly food bags our family receives have been such a blessing. They truly help lighten the load and make it easier to ensure our home has what we need throughout the week. With busy schedules and rising costs, having this support brings real peace of mind. We are grateful for the care, kindness, and consistency the church has shown. Your generosity is making a meaningful difference in our lives, and we appreciate you more than you know." Another family stated, "The food assistance has helped tremendously. Planning meals can sometimes be overwhelming, especially with the rising costs of groceries."

First Baptist Church food assistance program is unique with regard to the length of time that families are sponsored, which provides our families with security. Also, the rotated menus provide a variety and our families love that they are receiving meals to cook, in addition to snacks.

As you can see, your church family is making a positive difference in the lives of others. Southwest is extremely blessed to have First Baptist Church as a community partner and because of your dedication our students are able to come to school ready to learn. We look forward to your continued partnership.
