Transcript of the last sermon Dr. Aldrich delivered at the First Baptist Church of Gastonia on December 30, 2012 - Part 3

My second turning point was from fundamentalist theology to a more open stance toward truth. My home pastor, whom I admired very much but later came to disagree with his viewpoints, would stand in the pulpit and call Harry Emerson Fosdick an agent of the devil. Our closing hymn will be one written, composed by Harry Emerson Fosdick*.

I was a junior at Wake Forest College before I learned that Fosdick was one of the most creative voices that the American pulpit ever knew. That same pastor placed charts on the rostrum around the pulpit on Sunday nights that charted the second coming of Christ. He just knew everything that was going to happen before Christ came back again. Well, I was a high school student then and he had me so scared that I didn't think I was going to be able to graduate from college or get married before the end of the world came. I grew up thinking that to become a Christian I just had to adopt a rigid set of orthodox beliefs and doctrines. That, however, is not what Jesus said. Jesus said "Come follow me, and a I will make you to become fishers of men." I like the first part of that especially "Come follow me and I will make to you", I will remake you, I will transform you, I will make you a new creature by my love and grace. I will say my fundamentalist background did introduce me to the basic doctrines of the Christian faith, and I'm grateful for that. But It did not lead me to understand the deeper, richer application of those doctrines, those teachings to the way I was going to live.

Jesus calls us to a new way of life, to a new relationship to God, to a new relationship to each other, to other people. When I was struggling with theological questions that I had never thought of at Wake Forest College I literally thought my professors were trying to take my faith away. Instead, they were challenging me to examine my faith, to make sure I knew what it was, to make sure that it was authentic, to make sure it spoke to my heart and my innermost needs.

During this time, E. Stanley Jones, the Methodist evangelist missionary to India came to Raleigh for a series of meetings. He helped me so much to understand that, if I got my relationship to God straight, my doctrines would take care of themselves. Becoming a Christian is a matter of relationships, relationship to God, relationship to each other. The fundamentalist cup was just too small to hold the breadth and the depth of the larger Christian faith that I learned as I grew to understand it.

(*note: the closing hymn referred to in the sermon, was "God of Grace and God of Glory")
