NOTES FROM PASTOR DWAYNE

DOERS OF THE WORD

Last week I asked Jamie Lewis, who directs our SEAM program if her students would create a few visuals to help us see the reality of just what is happening, perhaps more correctly what is not happening in today's Gaston County Churches.

Jamie recruited Josephine and Brie (pictured on page 2) and they agreed to lend their artistic talents. The students did a great job creating five poster-art pieces for us.

The numbers on the boards represent the realities of five key Baptist churches across our county. The aggregate demographics of these five congregations are beyond astounding.

First, consider the combined **64.49** acres of real estate on which the five congestions are housed.

The second key demographic is the combined heated square feet of these churches, which totals **188,649 square feet**. This is two and a half times larger than Bank of America Stadium where our Carolina Panthers play their home games.

Of course these church buildings and land are also extremely valuable, with a combined tax value of \$13,900,000. I noticed in the news this week that Panthers newly hired coach Frank Riech just purchased a \$3.4 million dollar house. I guess the church can't really point fingers at his perceived opulence when we are housed in properties that average almost \$3,000,000 each in value.

But the final two numbers are perhaps the most disconcerting. I have visited and preached in each of these five churches. This has permitted me to witness firsthand that the combined weekly attendance of all five congregations is no more than **385 people**.

To add one more element to the visual before us consider one final number. That number is **65**. What does 65 represent? I am glad you asked. This number 65 tells a story that sounds an alarm.

Our community does not have only the five churches whose demographics are summarized here. Rather we have over 700 plus congregations whose chief instruction from Christ is to love God and in turn, love our neighbors as ourselves.

Yet while this overwhelming "Christian" county has found the wherewithal to construct extravagant worship sites for a tiny few, it has exhibited only the begrudging will to build and barely sustain a single crisis homeless shelter that can house a mere 65 souls.

Night after night, cold week after cold week, and sweltering summer day after day, over 400 men, women, and children remain unsheltered and unprotected from the elements while 385 of us file in and out of **multi-million dollar facilities**. And the number of unhoused neighbors is growing - all while the **385 attendance** number continues to plummet and age.

My prayer is that we, who for generations have heard God's Word, will become doers of God's Word. May our facilities become houses of prayer and healing for all people. May we not merely be moved by the numbers before us. May we finally be changed to meet needs all around us.

"Moving from the Pew to the Pavement" Isaiah 58

Identity with Direction By Novella Cruce Jer 17:5-8

5 This is what the Lord says: "Cursed are those who put their trust in mere humans, who rely on human strength and turn their hearts away from the Lord. 6 They are like stunted shrubs in the desert, with no hope for the future. They will live in the barren wilderness, in an uninhabited salty land. 7 "But blessed are those who trust in the Lord and have made the Lord their hope and confidence. 8 They are like trees planted along a riverbank, with roots that reach deep into the water. Such trees are not bothered by the heat or worried by long months of drought. Their leaves stay green, and they never stop producing fruit.

When we are not rooted in our identity in Christ, we tend to place more trust and confidence in human beings. We are swayed and even changed by our circumstances. Every time we expect people to be the plumbline for the ultimate truth, we are turning aside from God. Everything we receive through anyone on earth must be viewed through the lens of God's truth. God establishes leaders in our lives to guide, teach and disciple us, but it is extremely easy to become dependent on them rather than the one who sent them. We are susceptible to deception and have to keep our focus on

God so that we are not led astray by the outward. We do not find our security in the economy, politics, a spouse etc. We find our security in God. God leads us along the right path if we allow him to. Sometimes that path looks like we are in the

valley of the shadow of death. We can be confident and fear no evil if we are looking in the right direction.

Paul said in Philippians 1:21, NIV: "For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain." The word live in this passage in Greek means to actively live as opposed to being stagnant. The next verse in Philippians speaks of fruitful labor while living here on earth. Our job is to be kingdom focused so that we aren't distracted and overwhelmed.

Do you know where you are going? Is your path fruitful?

PRAYER FOR TODAY

Jehovah, Almighty, our world is filled with voiceless, marginalized people who must feel alone, abandoned and fearful. Today I pray that these brothers and sisters will experience an awareness of Your holy presence.
